## SHGC Empowers Future Innovators Through Valedictory Ceremony of AI And Web Tech Apprenticeship Program

The Department of Computer Science at Sant Hirdaram Girls College, Bhopal, successfully culminated its rigorous Apprenticeship Program with a formal Valedictory Ceremony. This intensive program was meticulously crafted for the final-year scholars of the BCA & B.Sc. streams implemented in strategic partnership with Technology Developer's, Bhopal. The core objective was to furnish students with substantive industrial exposure, thereby effectively delineating the chasm between theoretical academic constructs and pragmatic, real-world applications.

The two-month in-house apprenticeship, thematic under Modern Web Tech & Gen AI, spanned from August 1, 2025, to September 30, 2025. Guided by seasoned expert mentorship, participants were deeply immersed in cutting-edge technological paradigms, including the Flask framework and Generative Artificial Intelligence.

Sant Hirdaram Girls College, Bhopal is pleased to announce that a team of 10 faculty members successfully participated in a prestigious Online Faculty Development Programme (FDP) titled “Addressing Defamation Claims in the Age of Deepfake: Protecting Security & Privacy in Democratic India.” The FDP was organized by the Department of Computer Science & Engineering, UTD, Rajeev Gandhi Proudyogiki Vishwavidyalaya (RGPV), Bhopal under the aegis of the AICTE Training and Learning (ATAL) Academy. The programme was held from 17<sup>th</sup> November 2025 to 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2025.

The FDP focused on the rising challenges associated with AI-generated deepfake technologies, especially their implications for defamation, privacy protection, cybersecurity, and the integrity of democratic systems in India. Key sessions covered legal frameworks, digital forensic techniques, IT regulations, data protection strategies, ethical use of emerging technologies, and methods to counter misinformation and identity manipulation in the digital era.

Dr. Madhavi Gaur, Head, Department of Zoology, delivered an in-depth and application-based lecture on soil and vermicompost analysis, emphasizing soil quality, composition, and biological decomposition processes.

Subsequently, Dr. Shanta Belani, Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry, provided a simple and clear explanation of basic concepts such as acid-base theory, pH, and buffer solutions.
