SHGC Organizes 5 Day Academic Initiative on Vedic Mathematics for Holistic Learning

Bhopal, 27th September 2025, The Department of Mathematics at Sant Hirdaram Girls College, Bhopal, successfully organized a five-day Certificate Course on Vedic Mathematics from 23rd to 27th September 2025. It was designed to refine students speed, accuracy, and logical acumen, the course offered an immersive exploration of India's ancient yet remarkably practical mathematical heritage. Sixty-five students from varied academic disciplines enthusiastically participated in the program.

The inaugural session was graced by Dr. Sandeep Malhotra, Professor at Govt. Dr. Shyama Prasad Mukherjee College, Bhopal. In his keynote address, he underscored the relevance of Vedic Mathematics in the light of the National Education Policy (NEP). Demonstrating classical methods such as Urdhva Tiryak and Ekadhikena Purvena, Dr. Malhotra showcased their efficacy in solving intricate problems with unmatched simplicity and speed—proving especially advantageous for aspirants of competitive examinations.

Over five days, participants engaged in interactive sessions that combined theory with rigorous practice. Students applied Vedic techniques to real-time problem-solving, thereby experiencing their versatility and applicability beyond conventional mathematics.

The valedictory session was presided over by Dr Dalima Parwani, Principal of the College, who, in her address, lauded the initiative as a vital step toward reviving and recontextualizing India's intellectual traditions.
