




Career Building Workshop organized for Biological Science students


Career Building Workshop organized for Biological Science students

SHGC hosts an interactive session with Shri Manmohan Vaidya, marking its first collaboration with NEST Bharat



SHGC Hosts Insightful Session on The Role of AI in Enhancing Critical Thinking through Case Study Methodology

On 26th September, 2025, Department of Commerce in collaboration with Management Circle, the Commerce Club and the Training & Placement Cell of Sant Hirdaram Girls College, Bhopal, organized an engaging and thought-provoking session on the role of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in enhancing critical thinking through case study methodology. The session was conducted by esteemed faculty members Dr. Jagdish Bhagwat and Dr. Megha Jain from Jaipuria Institute of Management, Indore.

The speakers emphasized that while securing a job today may be relatively easier, sustaining and excelling in it requires continuous critical thinking and adaptability. They highlighted that the pervasive use of AI, though transformative, can sometimes impede independent thought and decision-making if not approached mindfully. One key takeaway from the session was the recommendation that AI should act as a “Co-Pilot” to assist human decision-making, rather than an “Autopilot” that replaces critical thinking.

As part of the session, students participated in a stimulating case study activity that encouraged practical application of critical thinking skills. The competition brought out outstanding performances, with Subhana Khan and her team securing the top position, followed closely by Mariyah Khan and her group in second place, and Saniya with her group earning the third position. Adding further enthusiasm to the event, a business quiz was also organized where students showcased their knowledge and presence of mind.

This enlightening session was graced by the presence of Dr. Dalima Parwani, Principal, who appreciated the depth and relevance of the discussions.

The session received an overwhelming response from the students, fostering an environment of active learning and introspection.


The event was graced by the Special Guest of Honour, Mr. Arjun Shakya, a renowned choreographer, whose presence elevated the charm of the evening.
